


The term "only begotten" in John 1:14 is taken from the Greek word monogenes, which means "unique, only one." I like that rendering because Jesus is unique!

The church He founded is also unique. It has never been duplicated. He gave it a unique message, a unique power, a unique mission. That church is alive and well on planet earth today! The United Pentecostal Church International is a vital part of that church and bears its unique characteristics.

How is the UPCI unique? Let me simplify the answer to facilitate both clarity and brevity.

First, the UPCI focuses on the centrality of the Word. Our pulpits are still situated in the center of the church, not to one side. Many churches are satisfied with a lectern set to one side where occasional homilies are delivered. An alter or other icon takes center stage.

Worship is imperative and should be part of our services - but it must never usurp the role of the Word. Music is not designed as the primary medium for the message. "For God hath chosen by the foolishness of preaching to save them which believe" (I Corinthians 1:21). Timothy was told to "preach the word" (II Timothy 4:2). Not even public prayer or the exercise of spiritual gifts should supplant the teaching of God's Word. Music, worship, prayer, spiritual gifts - all these augment the proclamation of the Word but they never supersede it.

UPCI pastors are men of the Word. The Bible is our creed. To preach it is our privilege; to keep it central is our duty.

Secondly, the UPCI makes room for the operation of the Spirit of God. Our roots are in the supernatural moving of the Spirit. We haven't bowed before the image of formalism.

The vocal spiritual gift of inspiration and power, as well as those of revelation, are granted their rightful place in our services and in our daily lives. God's sovereign right to spiritual leadership of His people is never denied.

The Pentecostal distinctions of dancing in the Spirit, exuberant worship and praying aloud together are still with us. When people grow tired of cold, dry, formal services they know they can find spiritual refreshing at a Pentecostal church. When folks only want religion they can find it in almost any temple, cathedral or church. But when they

basis. Thank Him! God has blessed us with the Holy Ghost and His continual care and guidance. Thank Him!



The Truth About Water Baptism

A discussion concerning the subject of "Water Baptism" generally provokes differing viewpoints. However, to know truth, one must go to the source of truth, God's Word! Clearly then, to understand the truth about baptism. we cannot look to man's ideas, viewpoints. religious creeds or church books. We must go to the Bible! When we stand before our Judge, we will be evaluated according to His Word. "For ever, O Lord, thy Word is settled in heaven" (Psalm 119:89).

There is no shortage of Bible material concerning baptism. In fact, it is one of the clearest and most documented principles of true Christianity. Therefore, as we study the Scriptures, the Holy Spirit will guide us into all truth (John 16:13).

Mark Firstly. states, "He that believeth and is baptized shall be saved", and I Peter 3:21 proclaims, "Baptism doth also now save us". These scriptures, along with others (John 3:5, Acts 2:38, Acts 10:48, Acts 22:16 and Galatians 3:27) definitely state that baptism is a necessary part of our salvation experience. Why? Because, as Acts 2:38 and Acts 22:16 tell us, it remits or washes away sins. Obeying water baptism is a scriptural must!

Secondly, since baptism is such an important step toward salvation, what form should it take? The very MOVEMBER 1989

"baptize" has for its root the Greek word baptizo which literally means submerge, dip. plunge, immerse." A11 scriptural references of baptism support position. Please note these three: 1) When Jesus was baptized by John, He straightway "went UD of the water" (Matthew 3:16). 2) the Ethiopian eunuch and Philip "went down both into the water ... and he baptized him" (Acts 8:38). 3) told the Romans that are buried with Him by baptism" (Romans 6:4). A Biblical baptism must be an immersion in water.

Thirdly, what formula should be used in administering baptism? Peter in Acts 2:38 stated, "be baptized everyone of you in the name of Jesus Christ". Philip baptized the Samaritans "in the name the Lord Jesus" (Acts 8:16). Paul baptized twelve of John the Baptist's disciples "in the name of the Lord Jesus" (Acts 19:5). Throughout the book of Acts the name of Jesus was used as the formula in baptism. 3:17 Colossians emphatically "And declares whatsoever ye do in word or deed, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus". 4:12 Acts states. "Neither is there salvation in any other: for there is none other name under heaven given among men, whereby we must be saved." Biblical baptism is in Jesus' name.

We cannot leave to mere chance or speculation the essential of Christian baptism. Even though some have traditionally used other forms and have mistakenly substituted other formulas, we must seek out the truth of the Bible.

As we have seen in Scriptures. the truth about water baptism is that one must be immersed in water in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins. For some reason, with some people, the Scriptures are not the truth. Therefore, in order to give them an accepted understanding the fact, we investigate another source, and that source is history. It supports the facts which the Bible gives.

In the Encyclopedia Britannica, eleventh edition, volume 3, pages 365 and 366 is this statement: "The baptismal formula was changed from the name of Jesus Christ to the words - Father, Son, and Holy Ghost, by the Catholic Church in the second century." This is historical proof that the original church baptized in Jesus' name.

Hastings Encyclopedia of Religion, volume 2, pages 377, 378, and 379 give us 1) these facts: Christian administered baptism was using the words, "In the name of Jesus". 2) The use of a trinitarian formula of sort was not suggested in Continued on page ten




Praise the Lord from Hodgenville!




early church history. 3) Baptism was always in the name of the Lord Jesus, until the time of Justin Martyr, when the triune formula was used.

In the <u>Catholic Encyclo-</u> <u>pedia</u>, volume 8, Justin Martyr was one of the early fathers of the Roman Catholic Church. He introduced a new idea of baptism.

In the New International Encyclopedia, volume 22, page 477, "The term trinity was originated by Tertullian, a Roman Catholic Church father."

History testifies to the authenticity of the Scriptures. Baptism (by immersion) in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins, is not a prerogative, but an imperative. "And ye shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free" (John 8:32).


