

Early Signs of Failure

- 1. Failing to be attracted by sin or evil.
- 2. Seldom failing to be rejected by a sinner.
- 3. Rarely failing to hear objections from unbelievers.

The Word of God reminds us that **failure** to pursue idolatry, lying, envy, lust, hate and murder can result in the discovery of the Love of God, truth, charity, brotherly love and life eternal!

Advanced Stages of Failure

- 1. Failing to understand why some people reject us.
- 2. Seldom failing to be hurt or surprised by this.
- 3. Rarely failing to be strengthened by it.

"But if you suffer for doing good, and you endure it, this is commendable before God. To this you were called, because Christ suffered for you, leaving you an example, that you should follow in His steps. He committed no sin, and no deceit was found in his mouth." (I Peter 2:20-22, NIV).

Yes, Jesus Failed! According to Peter, He failed to commit sin and He failed to deceive anyone. He failed to fall prey to the temptations of Satan. He failed to allow anyone or anything to change His purpose or deter Him from accomplishing His plans for our good. 
Jesus also **failed** to stay in the grave. He **failed** to let evil destroy His promises to us and **failed** to allow our hope to be stolen from us!

from God.



Satisfied -But Lost

Mark 8:36-37, "For what shall it profit a man, if he shall gain the whole world, and lose his own soul? Or what shall a man give in exchange for his soul?"

True satisfaction doesn't come in things, but in God. We can be satisfied doing what we want to do, but that's not as important as what we want to be.

One man said, "If the grass is greener on the other side of the fence, you can be sure the water bill is higher over there, too."

A cartoonist drew a picture showing two fields about the same size, with plenty of luscious green grass in each field, and it showed a mule in each field with his head through the fence, eating grass from the other mules' pastures. All around each mule was plenty of grass, yet the grass in each field seemed greener and fresher. In the process, the mules were caught in the fence and were unable to get loose. The caption at the bottom read. "DISCONTENTMENT". This, of course, is the opposite of satisfaction.

You can pick any dish you want from the smor-gasbord of human philoso-

phy and it will leave you hungry and searching for something else to satisfy. Many try hard to be religious and be sincere but are still running blind, bored and baffled. They're attempting to fill the inner vacuum of their lives with everything but the only thing.

Robert Ingersol was a bold agrostic. He spent many years of his life opposing and attacking the scriptures and the cause of Jesus Christ. I'm sure he was satisfied with what he believed, but he was lost. He was sincere, but sincerely wrong. On his death bed he cried aloud "I see flames and I'm sliding into them!"

The man who lay daily at the gate of the temple, which is called beautiful, to ask alms of those who entered into the temple (Acts Chapter 3) was expecting to receive alms from Peter and John. But, to his amazement, instead of receiving a coin, he was healed of his infirmity through the power of God, in the name of Jesus Christ.

Here was a man who was statisfied with a coin for many years, but had failed to receive what he needed from God. He sat in

the shadow of Herod's beautiful temple for a long time but never received deliverance from the condition that had him bound.

Many people close their eyes to reality, and say "I'm just as good as so and so," but that doesn't change their spiritual condition. You can feel a sense of security in the things you're doing, but that isn't salvation. You can be "satisfied but lost." Jesus said, "Except a man be born of water and spirit, he cannot enter into the Kingdom of God." John 3:5

He mentions here the two elements of the New Birth, the birth of water and the birth of the Spirit. When this was carried out on the birthday of the New Testament Church, Peter commanded them to be baptized in Jesus' name (this was the birth of water) and went on to say, "Ye shall receive the gift of the Holy Ghost." (This is the birth of the Spirit.)

St. John 3:5 was fulfilled in Acts 2:38, and the promise is unto you and your children.

A Born Again experience like Jesus taught is the only thing that will satisfy your soul.



OVERCOMING DISCOURAGEMENT

l Peter 2:1-10

Wherefore laying aside all malice, and all guile, and hypocrisies, and envies, and all evil speakings.

There are many things that can come to our heart that can hinder us. When we cannot touch God with a free spirit, we do not have the peace and victory in our lives. Hebrews 12:2 considers these things to be weights.

In the first verse of this chapter Peter tells us to lay aside these things that have become a hindrance to us (to lay aside means to remove them from our view or out of our thinking for now). We are to approach God as we did in the day of our conversion. We are to become as babes in Christ, and to look to Jesus as our Redeemer. Experience has taught us that He was kind, easy and full of mercy. He lifted us then and He will lift us up now. We can come into His presence!

When we come to God, we are coming to the Living Stone and rightly so for we are living stones. We are children of God by his own will and power. It is our right to come to our Father, for we are flesh of His flesh and bone of His bone. We fail to realize that God as a father has a close relationship to His children. The world has rejected God and does not understand our wonderful relationship with Him. It was God's choice to have a family and as a Father he loves as with a great love. We have a birth right that entitles us to come boldly into His presence to find grace and mercy in the time of need. When our heart is weighted down, we need God to remove from us that which has troubled us and restore our heart before His presence.

He has built as up into a Spiritual

House, which is His house. Since we were born into His Holy family, He has qualified us to be a Holy Priesthood. In this position we can offer up spiritual sacrifices. We have the right to send up prayers of love and faith to God as our Father. Prayers that He will answer because He has promised to do so. Jesus purchased this relationship for us when he died on the Cross. It is through His Blood that we have these privileges.

God in all His greatness chose to lay in Sion (church) a chief corner stone, elect and precious. He gave us a wonderful look at the relationship that the Son had with His Father. Jesus displayed the privilege that a son of God has in prayer. (At the tomb of Lazarus, when Jesus prayed he said, "And I knew that thou hearest me always" John 11:42) He let us know that a son of God is always heard by his Father. 
