He So Loved That He Gave

The miracle of Jesus Christ was that He not only was God manifest in the flesh, but that His character was of and still is, one of constant giving -more! Would it not have been enough that the spirit of the Almighty God "squeezed" Himself into a human body and allowed that Spirit to flow out from Him? That was a miracle of miracles! However, God so loved that He gave even more than the incarnation. How humbly He came - a babe born in a manger. He allowed Himself to be raised in a very common home and even worked in a carpenter shop. Was that not enough to prove His humility and love? He refused to preach until He was thirty years of age and was baptized by John the Baptist, simply to fulfill the Law. He carefully chose twelve disciples and even one of those betrayed Him. UNUSUAL GIVING

His love of giving reached so far down to rescue a woman that had five husbands. His love had no bounds. Another example was during a terrible storm on Lake Galilee. The Bible states that a great wind blew; the sea was out of control, but not for this Christ who loved His disciples. They, in their little boat,

were terrified, but Jesus even invited Peter to come to Him on such a stormy sea. God beckons us to walk with Him sometimes when everything seems upside down.
